Engineering Status

The Board of Directors have now received the final version of the Presqu'ile Point Lighthouse Restoration engineering study. Since its arrival in early November, the Board have been meeting regularly to try and come to a firm understanding of the contents as delivered by Andre Scheinman (heritage preservation consultant) and John Silburn (restoration engineering). Taking our understanding one step further; the Board sourced a review of the initial study from PJ Consultants Ltd. who also provide services for restoration and protection of masonry structures.

While there were some differences of opinion on technical matters, they also found many issues on which there was agreement.

The history of construction; quality of materials and workmanship; weather and water damage and even seismic concerns were considered. Remedial actions to preserve/restore the lighthouse were addressed. Both agreed the Wood cladding and girting had done a good job of preserving the structure over the past 120 years.

There are two options at hand plus combinations of the two.

- i) The repair and replacement of the wooden girts where necessary and replacing all of the shingles extending these down to the original bottom location at the pediment. This includes repair and restoration of the stone and cement work around the base and re-grouting or repointing where necessary.
- ii) The removal of the wood cladding completely exposing the original stone. This would require extensive reinforcing with stainless steel rod; re-grouting of the interior cavity which is rubble filled between the inner and outer limestone work. Complete repointing and surfacing would also be required.

Common to both would be the existing windows as they would be reinforced and re-gazed in their true Gothic shape. This would require reinforcing above and around the openings, noting that some of the original windows that have been covered shut, would be re-opened. And, of course, the provision for a new lamp house (cupola) replicating the old one with a working light.

As you might appreciate, there is a huge difference in costs between the two approaches and that has to be taken into consideration. At any rate we have a long road ahead of us but this step has been taken.

Historical Article #4 -

Building the Lighthouse

Construction of the Presqu'ile Point Lighthouse happened very quickly after Hugh Baird, the Civil Engineer for the project, had inspected the site and provided his specifications in August of 1837. The main part of the work appears to have been completed during the summer of 1838. Archived documents show that B. McMahon, one of the Commissioners, reported to the Commission in a letter dated August 7, 1841 (see heading below) in which he refers to a previous letter dated April 10, 1839. Both of these letters provide interesting details about the progress of construction.

4-5 Victoriæ.

Appendix (G. G.)

A. 18-11.

REPORT and Statement of Expenditure of the Commissioners for building the Presquile Light for 1840, transmitted by command of His Excellency the Governor General, for the information of the Legislative Assembly, pursuant to the Provincial Act, 7th Will. IV. Cap. 95.

To the Right Honorable Charles Baron Sydenham, one of the Members of Her Majesty's most honorable Privy Council, Governor General of British North America, &c. &c. The Commission had "issued Advertisement for Tenders" and as a result Mr. John McLeod became the Contractor "for the execution of the

whole work including the Lantern &c., at the sum of £1,050". The amount of £100 would be held back pending approval of the work by the Commission. Due to "the appropriation being made without any previous estimate of the work" a deficit of £150 would occur. This happened because the height of the tower had been increased during the work in order to make the light more visible at the western end of Presqu'ile Peninsula.

As of April, 1839, the Commission is informed that "The work has not progressed to completion as rapidly as Your Commission could have wished..." and that there were several things left to be done. The list included "the railing to the stairs, two coats of plastering, glazing the sashes, replacing the main door with one in terms of specification, some re-pointing and leveling of property around the building.." There were also plans to clear and burn an area of land near the lighthouse.

The August 1841 letter makes the general comment that "the work is generally a sound and substantial fabric, and well calculated to answer the purpose of its construction." However, there was a conflict.

John McLeod had sub-contracted the construction of the railing around the lantern to John Helms but refused to pay him out of the funds forwarded by the Commission. Mr. McMahon encourages the Commissioners to pay Mr. Helms as well as approve the final payment to the Contractor.

The report to the Commission in April 1839 also suggested a few additional items that had not been included in the original budget for the lighthouse. They seem reasonable - a lightning rod to protect the tower during storms, a bell to ring during periods of fog and "a quantity of land in the immediate vicinity of the Light House, for the use of the Keeper in providing firewood, &c." For now, however, there is no mention of a home for the Keeper.

In Closing:
