A Word From Chair Spencer

Hello fellow members. I hope by the time you are reading this newsletter we are well into the warm, sunny days of summer.

We all have been busy behind the scenes this winter furthering the cause of restoring our lighthouse. You were advised last fall with regard to the completion of the engineering study. This report was very positive in that the actual structure of the lighthouse is still in remarkable condition, although there are still some costly repairs that are required to enable the lighthouse to last another 175 years.

In late April, we met with Park Supt. Rob Cunningham.
This was of significant importance due to the fact that he is now bringing our restoration plans to the table with his superiors in Ontario Parks.

We also made a presentation to Brighton Council in early May requesting financial assistance for promoting the Presqu'ile Lighthouse Festival this summer. Our request of \$2000.00 was approved.



Congratulations to our Founder, Norman Bastin who received the honour of being known as the "Guardian Of Presqu'ile Lighthouse".

We have also recently applied for the Canada 150 Infrastructure Funding Opportunities Grant, which has earmarked 150 million dollars for infrastructure improvements.

Our local MP Rick Norlock and MPP Lou Rinaldi have provided us with written 100% support of our cause and have indicated they will do what they can to assist us.

Please continue to support our membership as the more people from our community on the membership list shows the politicians that there is a keen interest in this project.

Engineering Update

In May, 2015, Board members presented recommendations to Supt. Rob Cunningham of Presqu'ile Provincial Park. The full report is now on our website @ www.koppla.ca (under "Restoration")

Basically, these deal with the window structural strength and stabilization, removal and replacement of existing shingles; repair of roof structure and replacement of the cupola along with some repairs of existing brick work.

This report is now in the hands of the Engineers that Ontario Parks have on their team. Once they (hopefully) deem they are in agreement with our Game Plan, we would then work with the senior levels of Ontario Parks to gain authority to proceed with Phase II which is the preparation of drawings, and specifications for the restoration/preservation quotation process.

Once this happens, our input may be minimized as their Engineering team may "take over" the quotation process. It is our intent to continue to dialogue with Ontario Parks personnel to ensure they continue to communicate with our Preservation Society.

During the past few months, here are some of our activities:

- Two membership drives in May (another success story with details elsewhere in the newsletter)
- Preparation of our very successful June 6 Gala event (requiring hundreds of hours of volunteer time)
- Provide community education about our activities through ongoing seminars. (If you know of a group that would be interested in hearing about our cause, please let us know)
- Working with Ontario Parks (Presqu'ile Provincial Park) management team to complete the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) for our Festival being held on July 17-19, 2015 (It seems that their process is to establish a MOU for each of our activities at the Park)
- Preparation for the Fun Run and other activities associated with our 175th Festival celebrations
- Presentation of our recommendations to Ontario Parks, our local MP & MPP and the Municipality of Brighton
- We have applied for a Canada 150 Grant towards the preservation cost of the lighthouse but, we expect some hiccups because as part of the grant format, we had to either own the lighthouse or lease the structure which we do not. We did include a MOU whereby Ontario Parks has given us permission to work towards the goal of preserving the lighthouse so let's hope that works.

Historical Article #5 -

The Lighthouse: Big Light - Old Friend

The Presqu'ile Point Lighthouse was put to work immediately because the early 1840s saw a boom in lake traffic. Many settlers arrived on schooners in Presqu'ile Bay and made their way up country to establish new homes. The Village of Brighton, which was organized in 1831, attracted merchants and tradesmen to support the growing rural and urban population. The Village of Gosport, renamed during the 1840s from the original Newcastle, experienced a building boom as fishing and boat building picked up. The growing trade in lumber and wheat resulted in lots of traffic across John Nix's brand new (1841) wharf at the east end of Price Street.

Sailors and passengers alike would have gazed thankfully at the big stone lighthouse, called "The Big Light", standing guard

on the point as they sailed into Presqu'ile Bay. If they passed this way during bad weather, they would experience the warmth of the big light flashing out from the red cupola on top. Of course, it was especially from the cold, rough waters of the lake while approaching the Bay in bad weather that ship captains thanked their lucky stars they had a beacon showing them the way. For those in the business of transporting people and goods around Lake Ontario in those days, Presqu'ile Point Lighthouse would have become a good friend and companion.

But there was trouble brewing. A November 1842 inspection of the lighthouse revealed "water damage resulting from roof leaks, etc." as one report stated in its title. The report recommends a good deal of repointing, plastering and installation of tin gutters. On the other hand, some good news.. " ... in other respects - the house is clean and in good repair."



Another interesting document is found in the archives with the title "Specifications

For A Dwelling For The Keeper of Presque Isle Light House - 1842." We see from other documents that William Swetman, the first Keeper of Presqu'ile Point Lighthouse; did not move into this new house until 1846. The plans were for a substantial dwelling with a cellar "36 feet long by 26 feet wide and 8 feet deep all around" and "the principal storey to be 9 feet high." The walls were to be 18 inches thick and made of Kingston limestone "or some other of equal quality laid in lime and sand mortar."



The lighthouse keeper's cottage turned out to be solid and durable. It housed many keepers and their families over the years until the job of lighthouse keeper became obsolete. At some point, it gained a second storey and white framing but when the Interpretive Centre was built, the keeper's cottage was restored to its original appearance. It can be seen today to the east of the Interpretive Centre, a testament to those days of the schooner when the Presqu'ile Point Lighthouse undoubtedly saved lives and played a very critical role in the development of Brighton.
